


Needs: Maintain Existing Roadways


- 73 Miles of Arterials and Collectors in 2016 Study
 - Projected needs of \$103 million to bring <u>all</u> roads to "good" condition
 - Current annual expenditures averaging \$2.5 million for 3R projects
 - Backlog remains in excess of \$60 million = the dollar amount of maintenance and rehabilitation work that should have been completed, but had to be deferred due to funding deficiencies for Pavement Maintenance and/or pavement rehabilitation programs.
- To reach a recommend Pavement Condition Rating (PCI) of 68 need \$6 million per year





Goals include improving connectivity with other modes of transportation and systems to advance multi-modal transportation within the region, improve the efficiencies of the system's operations, and lay out a plan for future policy or operational changes.







Regionally Significant Road System








Madera County 2018 RTP/SCS Active Transportation Projects – Bike Facilities - Madera County








